

DOCTRINAL CLARITY FOR A CONFUSED GENERATION

It's no secret: we live in a world dominated by a lack of clarity. Whether it is over the definition of gender or the value of an unborn child, the world has fallen into a state of confusion. And behind it all is the lie of postmodernism: the idea that there is no such thing as objective truth. Echoing the words of Pontius Pilate, the modern man cynically asks, "What is truth?" (John 18:38). The very idea has become an antiquated concept.

Tragically, this kind of thinking has deeply permeated contemporary Christianity. Though many of us consider, however naively, evangelicalism to be immune to such ideology, the church has come to be shaped more by the world than the Word. For the sake of remaining relevant, pastors have set the Word of God aside, choosing rather to feed their hungry flocks with cute anecdotes and casual "talks." Starving and malnourished, God's people "long for the pure milk of the Word, so that by it [they] may grow in respect to salvation" (1 Peter 2:2). There is such a thing as truth, and God's Word is it.

The church is hemorrhaging, and only the clear application of God's Word will stop it. That is why the 2020 Shepherds' Conference theme is, "Twenty Twenty Vision: Doctrinal Clarity for a Confused Generation."
